Training on Creating Song Content with the Theme of Religious Moderation for Middle School Students in Jayapura Regency

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Abstract

Training to create song content on the theme of religious moderation for junior high school students in Jayapura Regency aims to instill the values of religious moderation and equip the younger generation with social responsibility in maintaining harmony. By using demonstration and question and answer methods, this training not only facilitates understanding of religious moderation but also involves students in the creative process of song creation. The results of the training show that music has effective emotional power in building solidarity and instilling awareness of the importance of interfaith dialogue and respect for differences. Students not only learn to compose songs, but also develop collaboration and message delivery skills through digital media, making them content producers capable of disseminating messages of religious moderation to a wider community. INTRODUCTION

Training on creating song content on the theme of religious moderation for junior high school students in Jayapura Regency, organized by a team of lecturers and STAKPN Sentani Church Music education staff, is part of a strategic effort to strengthen the values of tolerance and religious harmony among the younger generation. Jayapura Regency is an area with quite high religious diversity, so it is equip important to students with understanding of religious moderation from an early age. Through music, these messages can be conveyed in a more interesting and enjoyable way.

Religious moderation education is very important to provide from an early age, especially for junior high school students who are in the character formation phase. Religious moderation does not only mean a neutral attitude towards other religions, but more than that, it involves respect, cooperation and avoidance of extremism in religion (Hakim & Mudofir, 2023). This moderation lesson is important not only in the cognitive aspect, but also in the development of daily attitudes and behavior.

Music, as a universal medium that is easily accepted by the younger generation, offers an effective way to convey the values of

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religious moderation. Music has the power to influence emotions and behavior (Koelsch, 2014; MCDonald et al., 2022; Palazzi et al., 2019), so that through singing content with the theme of religious moderation, junior high school students can more easily absorb the values of tolerance, unity and harmony. In an educational context, music can also be used as a creative means to convey moral and religious messages in a more fun and interesting way.

In Jayapura Regency, the majority of junior high school students have studied music, either through school activities or in their social environment. Considering that music is part of their daily lives, training in creating singing content with the theme of religious moderation is a relevant and contextual strategy for instilling these values. Through this activity, students can learn not only about religious moderation theoretically, but also express it through creative works in the form of songs.

The main aim of this training is to encourage students to be able to create songs that contain messages of religious moderation and share their works with their peers and the wider community. In this way, the values of religious moderation can be spread more widely and accepted positively by the community. Apart from that, through this creative process, students are also taught to collaborate, work together, and respect each other, all of which are part of the practice of moderation itself.

Therefore, teaching them to produce musical content on the theme of religious moderation not only increases their understanding of moderation, but also equips them with digital skills that are relevant in the current era. The content they create can be uploaded to digital platforms, so it has a wider reach.

In the long term, it is hoped that this training will be able to instill strong values of religious moderation among junior high school students in Jayapura Regency. With the musical works they create; students will feel they have a responsibility to maintain harmony and peace in their environment. Through the songs they sing, it is hoped that a collective awareness will emerge of the importance of living side by side in religious diversity by respecting each other and working together.

Training to create song content on the theme of religious moderation for junior high school students in Jayapura Regency carried out by a team of lecturers and STAKPN Sentani Church Music education staff is an important and relevant initiative. By utilizing music as an educational medium, this training succeeded in equipping students with the values of religious moderation that they can carry and apply in their daily lives, while helping to build a more tolerant and competitive generation.

METHOD

The STAKPN Sentani Church Music lecturer and educational staff team held community service activities for junior high school students in Jayapura Regency, with a focus on training in creating song content on the theme of religious moderation. This activity uses demonstration and question and answer methods as the main approach to facilitate students' understanding of the importance of religious moderation and how to convey it through the medium of music.

The demonstration method is a very effective approach in teaching practical skills such as creating musical content. In this training. lecturers and education staff demonstrated ways to create songs with the theme of religious moderation, starting from composing lyrics to composing relevant music. The demonstration was carried out by introducing examples of songs that had messages about tolerance, unity and respect for differences. Through this demonstration, students can see directly the creative process in making songs, so that it is easier for them to understand the concepts and techniques presented.

The question-and-answer method is used as the main support to deepen students' understanding. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

In addition, this training has great potential to strengthen students' understanding of national values. Religious moderation is not only related to inter religious tolerance, but is also closely related to the spirit of unity as a diverse Indonesian nation (Salsabila Azahra & Zaenul Slam, 2022; Yusuf & Mutiara, 2022). By singing songs that encourage a sense of brotherhood regardless of religious background, junior high school students in Jayapura Regency will learn to be part of an inclusive and open society.

Music also has strong emotional power in building a sense of solidarity. In this training, students not only learn to compose songs, but also experience a creative process that teaches them the importance of working together and respecting other people's opinions. When they collaborate to create songs about religious moderation, they are invited to think critically about how these values can be applied in everyday life. Song content with the theme of religious moderation can also act as a tool to reject extremism. In an increasingly complex society, a narrow understanding of religion can trigger radicalism. > The melodies in the songs are arranged in such a way that they are easy for students to sing. Melodies that are too complicated can prevent students from feeling comfortable singing these songs. Focusing on simple, harmonious and attractive melodies is very important so that the message of religious moderation can be conveyed well and is easily remembered by students. Fun music also make will students more enthusiastically involved in the learning process.

> In creating songs, every part, from the intro, verse, to chorus, must consistently convey the message of religious moderation. The chorus or refrain can be the most important part, because it is usually easy to remember. Values such as respect for differences, compassion, and unity may be repeated in the chorus to emphasize the message. As a generation that is familiar with technology, junior high school students can be invited to use digital media to create singing content. Platforms such as simple music making apps or social media can be used to record and share their work. By using technology, students can also be more creative in adding sound or visual elements that support the message of religious moderation.

This strategy also involves students in the overall song production process. In addition to writing and singing songs, students can learn about how to record and edit music, as well as distribute content via online platforms.
